Kansas City Friends of Alvin Ailey Presents the Race, Place & Diversity Award to Olympian Jackie Joyner-Kersee and Community Leader Qiana Thomason

Kansas City, Missouri – Kansas City Friends of Alvin Ailey's annual Race, Place & Diversity Awards Dinner recognizes individuals and organizations that promote diversity, inclusion, and equity within the community and on a national level. The 2022 Awards Dinner will be held Thursday, November 3, 2022, at the Sheraton Crown Center.

This year's event will honor legendary **Olympian and philanthropist, Jackie Joyner Kersee**, and Kansas City's own **President and CEO of the Health Forward Foundation, Qiana Thomason**. The program will be moderated and emceed by award-winning journalist and **KSHB Anchor Dia Wall**. The event co-chairs are Calvin Ricks and Peg VanWagoner.

"This year's honorees have demonstrated their commitment to the very tenets of diversity and equity that the RPD Award represents. Just prior to the event, KCFAA will hold a special meet and greet with the Olympian and area youth involved in athletics including track and field and dance. Mrs. Joyner-Kersee will talk with area youth about leadership, service to others and taking care of their health. She will take questions from the audience and the media.

Jackie Joyner-Kersee, six-time Olympic medalist and Sports Illustrated Greatest Female Athlete of the 20th Century, is also lauded for her philanthropic work, including advocating for children's education, health, racial equality, social reform, and women's rights. In 1988 she founded the Jackie Joyner-Kersee Foundation, a multifaceted non-profit with programs to improve the quality of life for the youth and families it serves in the areas of education, health, after school care, and physical exercise in the East St. Louis area. Mrs. Joyner-Kersee is also the inaugural **Hoffman Legacy Honoree**, endowed by Kansas City philanthropists, Sharon and John Hoffman.

Qiana Thomason, President and CEO of the Health Forward Foundation, began her fight for equality in healthcare for underserved people years ago after personally experiencing hardships as an uninsured patient and later as an insured person subjected to potentially life-threatening medical racism. Throughout her career, she's worked tirelessly to advance the health and overall well-being of individuals living in marginalized communities.
